Sub: Action against institutes failing to comply with UPSMF directions.

Dear Sir/Ma'am,

1. UPSMF is committed towards creating a vibrant and high-quality nursing and paramedical ecosystem in the state of Uttar Pradesh and making it a hub of nursing and paramedical professionals in India.
2. Many initiatives are being undertaken by UPSMF to achieve the Hon'ble CM's vision. SMF is continuously working with nursing and paramedical institutes across the state to improve the quality of training across all institutes and has been undertaking multiple initiatives which require cooperation and compliance from all institutes.
3. Henceforth, it has been decided that institutes not complying with any order or directions of SMF shall be punishable with a monetary penalty and would be declared ineligible to be a center for annual examinations.
4. If the institute does not comply with the order/ directions within 14 days of levying the monetary penalty and/or does not pay the monetary penalty (as per clause 3), the approved seats in the institute across all courses would be reduced by 50%<sup>1</sup>.  
Further, if the institute does not comply with the order/ directions within 14 days of reducing the approved seats by 50% (as per clause 4), the institute will not be allowed to admit any new students in forthcoming admission cycles<sup>2</sup>.
5. Thereon, if the institute does not comply with the order/ directions within 14 days of freezing of admissions (as per clause 5), the institute will be de-affiliated from U.P. State Medical Faculty permanently<sup>3</sup>.

<sup>1</sup>Reduction in batch size will permanently reduce the number of sanctioned seats by 50% of the earlier approved capacity. Restoration to the earlier sanctioned capacity is possible as per the regular seat enhancement procedure, laid down by the UP SMF, after compliance with the particular policy, guideline, rule or regulation is established by the institute.

<sup>2</sup> Freezing admissions will make the institute ineligible to admit new batches of 1st year students in the subsequent academic year until compliance with the particular policy, guideline, rule or regulation is established by the institute.

<sup>3</sup> De-affiliation will lead to permanent removal of UPSMF affiliation status of the institute. Re-affiliation is possible as per the regular process of gaining fresh affiliation, laid down by the UPSMF, after compliance with the particular policy, guideline, rule or regulation is established by the institute.
